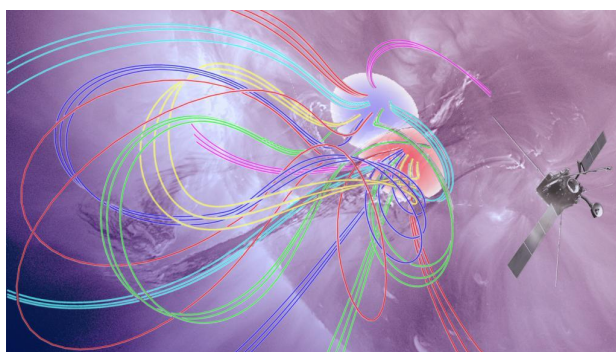

We are pleased to welcome **Pauline Simon**, who has joined the Laboratoire de Physique des Plasmas (LPP) as an Assistant Professor at Sorbonne University since September 1st.

After completing her PhD with the Space Plasmas team at LPP (2020–2023) under the supervision of Fouad Sahraoui and Sébastien Galtier, Pauline pursued a two-year postdoctoral fellowship at Queen Mary University of London (Department of Physics and Astronomy).

She now joins the **“Space Plasmas” team** to develop research at the interface of analytical, numerical, and observational turbulence in the solar wind, as well as predictive statistical methods applied to space weather.

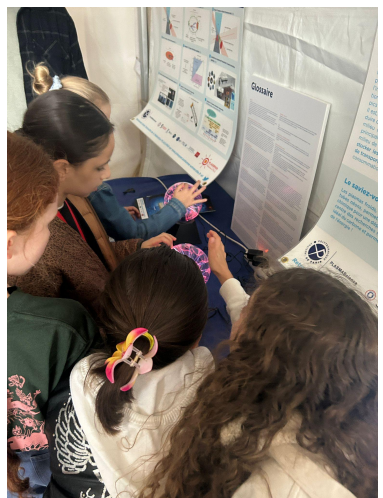
Fête de la Science Highlights
